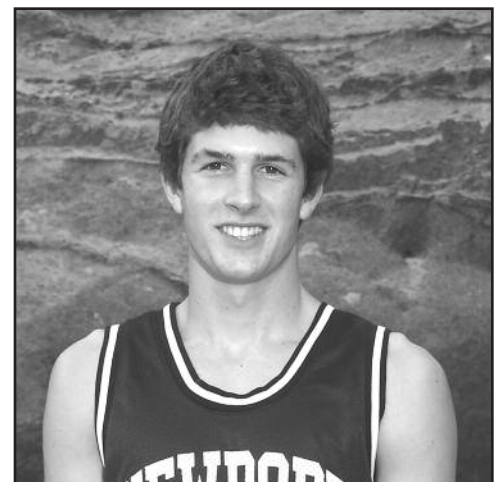


50 JAMIE DIEFENBACH SENIOR 6'8"

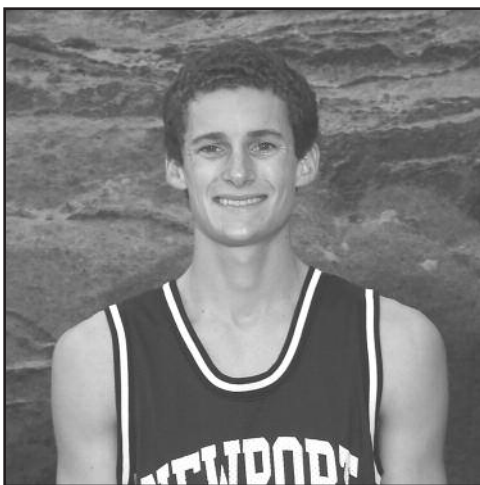
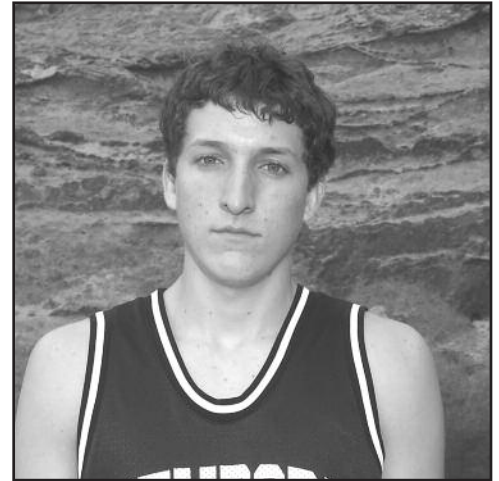

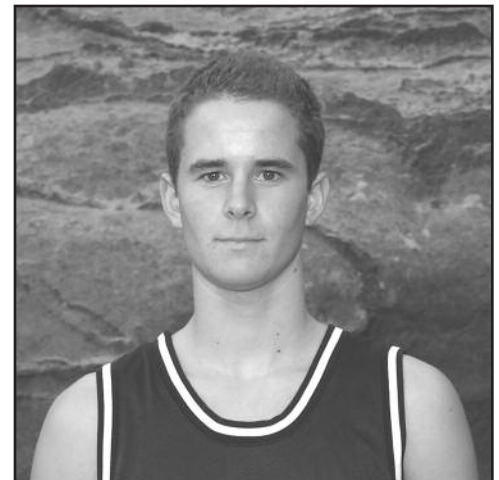


25 DENNIS HEENAN SOPHOMORE 6'3"

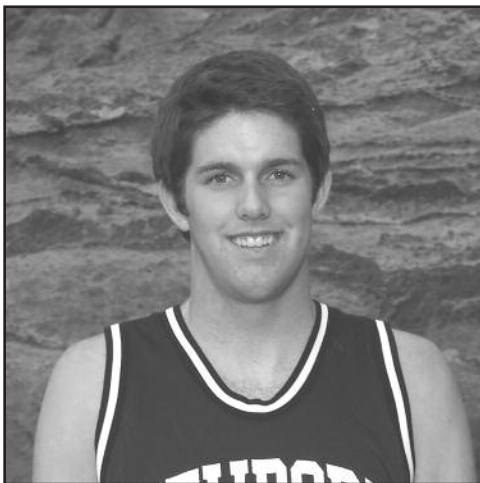
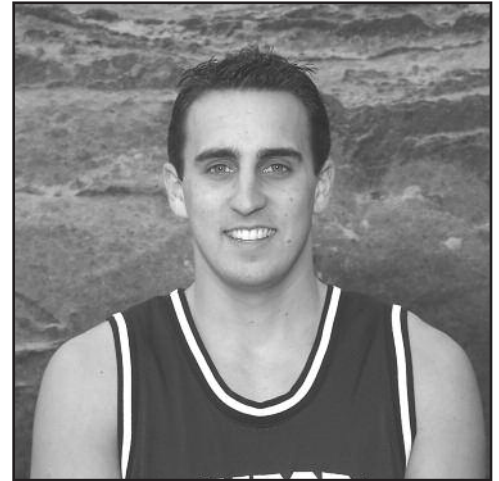

45 CHAD MACBETH

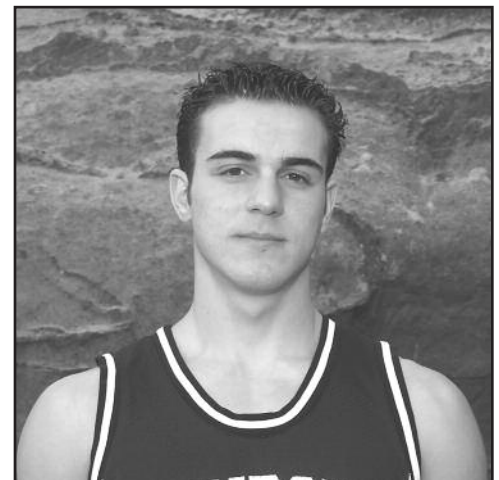
SENIOR 6'5"

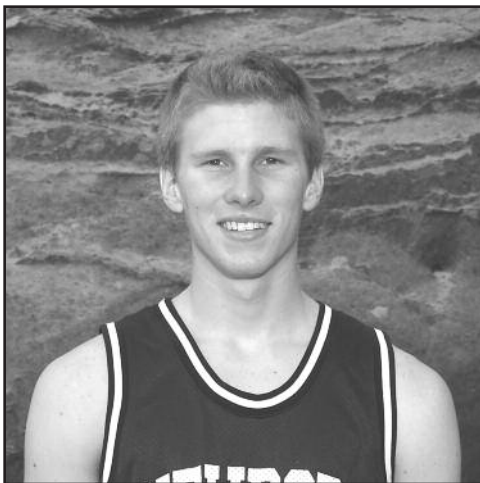
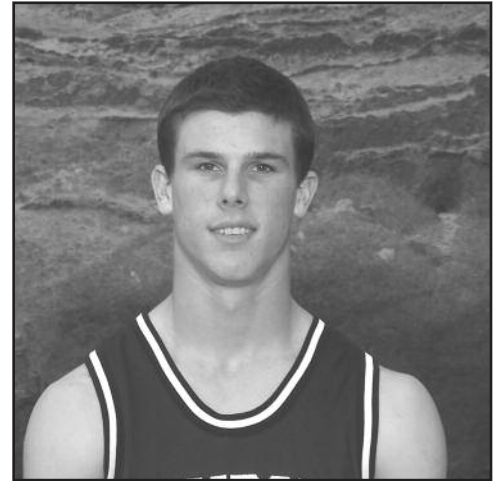

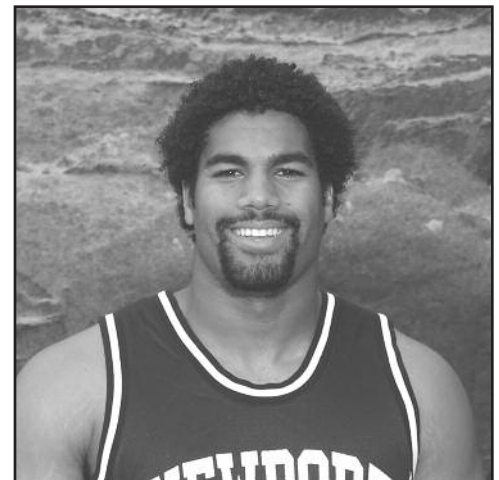


23 BRETT PERRINE JUNIOR 6'5"

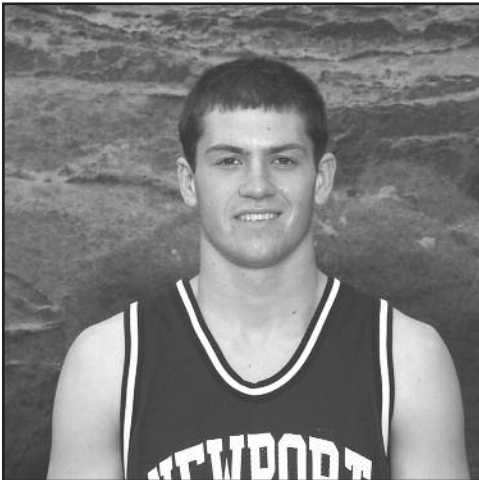
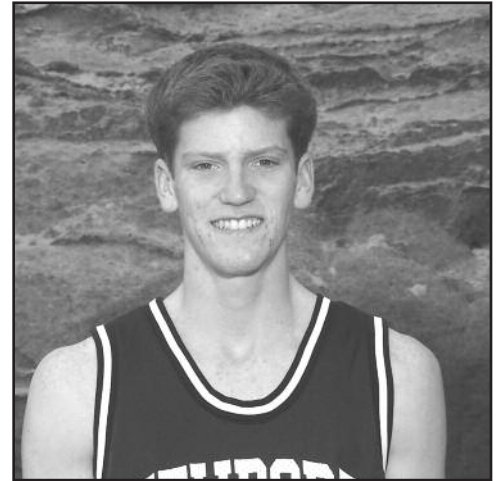

24 TED SLATER SOPHOMORE 6'3"

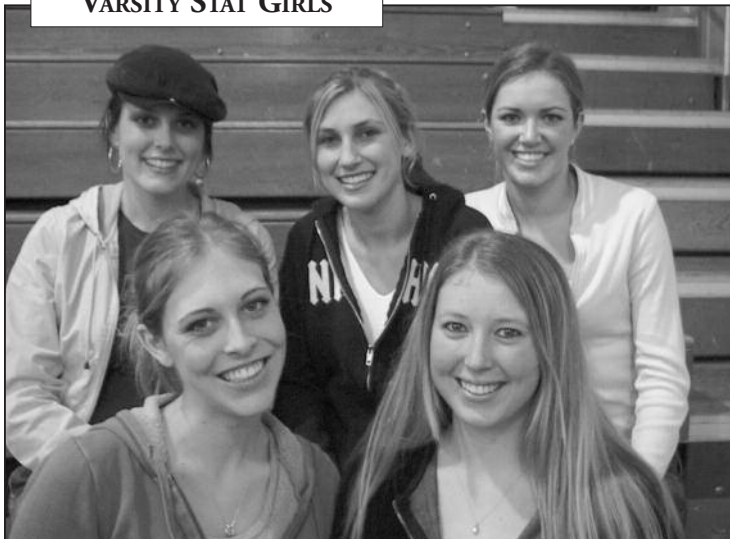

33 TAYLOR YOUNG JUNIOR 6'2"

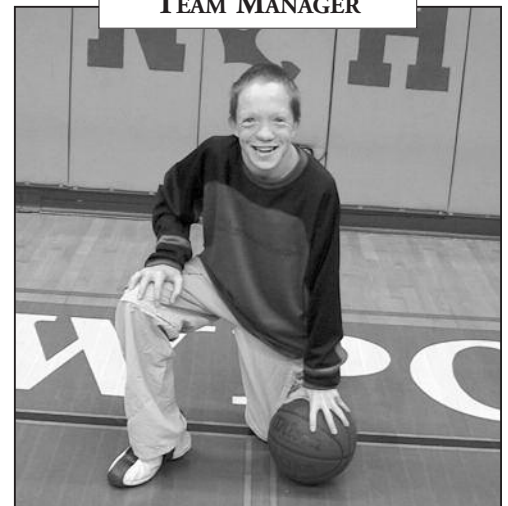
